**DETERMINANTS OF COORDINATION OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
STRATEGIES AT DIFFERENT LEVELS OF THE GLOBAL ECONOMY**

The article is devoted to a comprehensive study of global coordination of economic development strategies, identification of its main determinants, assessment of the latest trends in coordination at various levels of the global economy.

The system of scientific methods and approaches was used in the work, which made it possible to achieve the goals of the study. The study was carried out using the methods of theoretical generalization, comparative analysis, analysis and synthesis. Thanks to the system method, the theoretical and practical foundations of the formation and development of a system of global coordination of economic development strategies have been studied.

The article formulates the author's interpretation of the content of global coordination of economic development strategies as a process of voluntary agreement by the subjects of international economic relations of strategies and plans for economic development at the national, regional and global levels in the face of uncertainty and turbulence in the global environment, which together creates a synergistic effect in solving global problems of mankind. A typology of national strategies for socio-economic development is proposed. The reasons for the increasing role of global coordination as a new tool after the countries of the world switched to flexible exchange rates in the first half of the 1970s are analyzed.

It is found that unequal conditions, partly due to the lack of global coordination, create restrictions in the development of national economies and their chosen strategies. Fair exchange of information, joint action or mutually agreed policies can break down these boundaries of development and promote better outcomes of coordinating interaction.

It is concluded that the growth of trust between the subjects of international economic policy, the delegation of part of the powers to global institutions, the minimization of the heterogeneity of interests of members of international organizations and the reduction of politicization of decisions, the simplification of the rules for their adoption can increase the effectiveness of decisions of the subjects of international politics at various levels of the institutional architecture of the global coordination system. Strengthening international cooperation and governance should take place within the framework of institutional measures and incentives with a rethinking of the social architecture, values and other aspects of human development enshrined in the UN sustainable development goals.

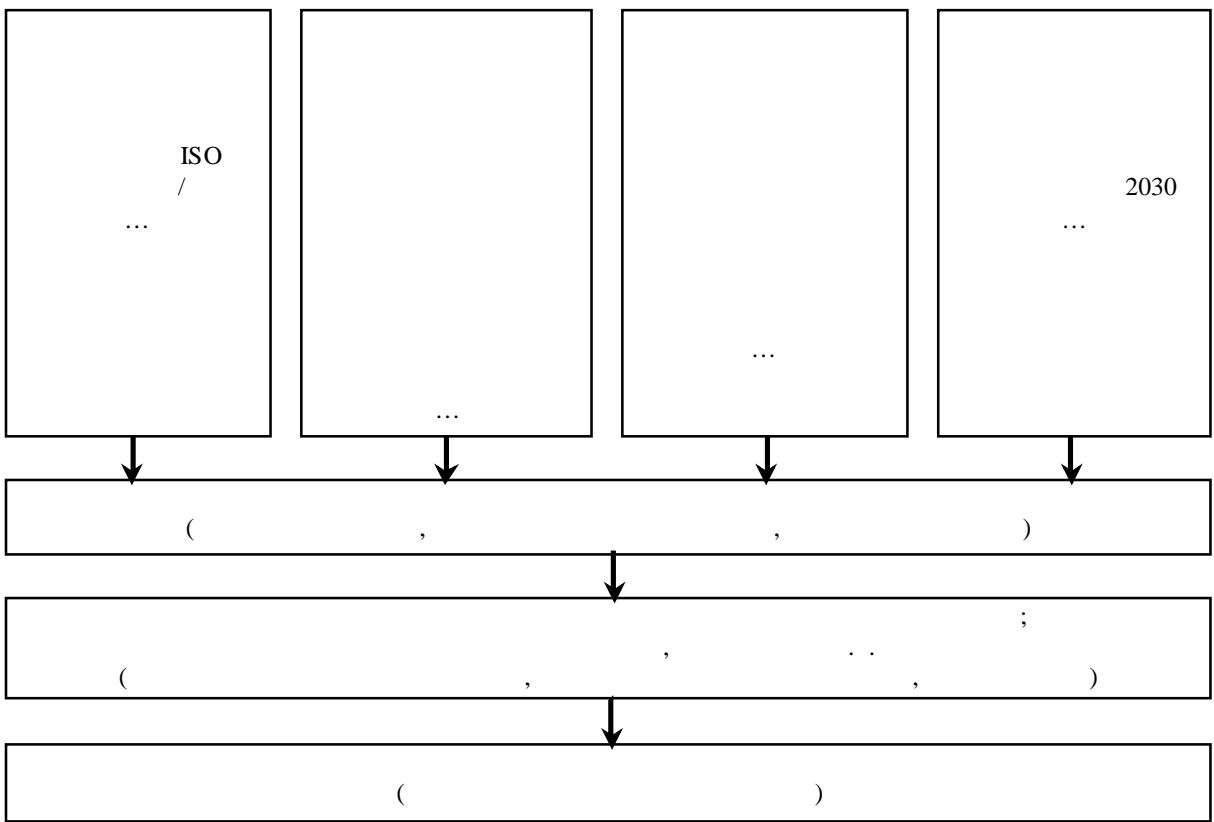
